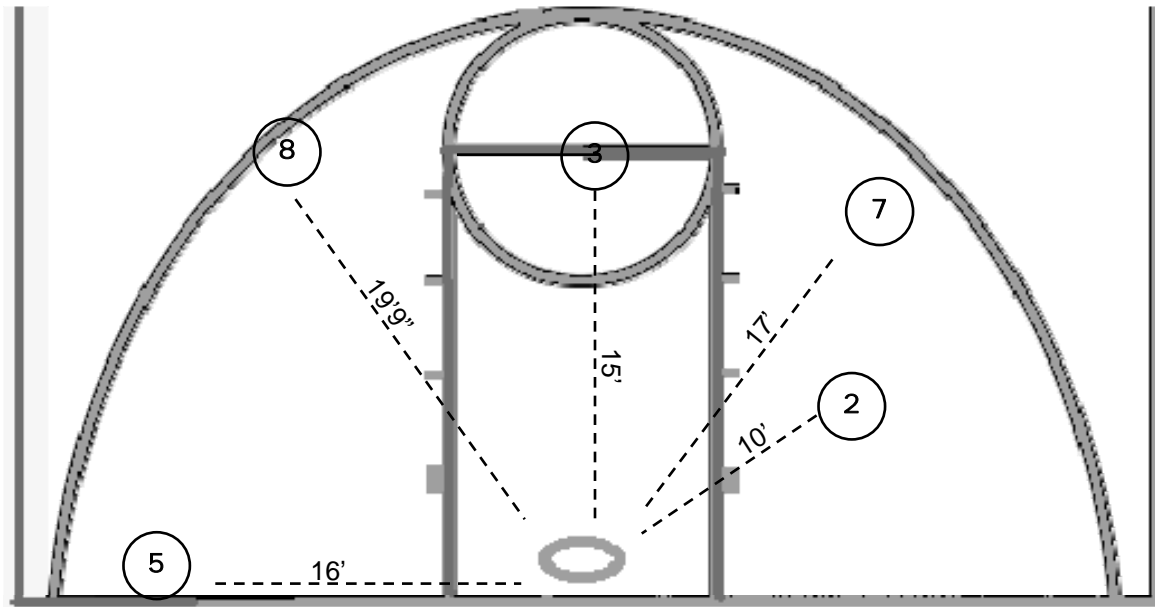


Spurs 2ball Court Layout



Game Rules for Players

How to begin the game: One player stands near mid-court holding the ball. His/her teammate stands on or near a numbered dot on the court. When the competition starts, the player with the ball must pass the ball to his/her teammate who shoots from a numbered dot.

Time: Players have 60 seconds to make as many baskets as possible from any of the five numbered dots.

Passing/Dribbling: Players must pass or dribble the ball as they move around the court.

Alternating shots: Players cannot shoot twice in a row. They must alternate shots with their teammates. In addition, an individual player may not shoot twice in a row from the same numbered dot. If these rules are violated when a shot is made, it will not be counted.

Violations: Traveling, double dribbling or palming the ball are considered violations and will result in a one point deduction from the final score for each occurrence.

Shooting from a numbered dot: Players must begin a shot with at least one foot touching the numbered dot. They may jump off the dot after shooting the ball, but jumping onto the numbered dot while shooting the ball is **NOT** a legal shot and points will **NOT** be scored if the shot is made.

Referees and Scorekeepers: Referees will determine if a made shot is legal and will judge motion violations. Scorekeepers will add shooting point values when legal shots are made, deduct any motion violations and determine a final score.
